
# SAFER STREETS, SHARED VOICES

Insights from public workshops on preventing violence against women and girls (VAWG) in outdoor public spaces in Belfast

### THE PROBLEM



# 98% of women (18+ yrs) and 73% of girls

(12-17 yrs)
in Northern Ireland have experienced at least one form of violence in their lifetime\*<sup>1,2</sup>










16% of women in Northern Ireland report the location of their worst recalled event occurring in public spaces, such as parks, forests, streets and public transport<sup>1</sup>

Not only is this a matter of safety and equality, it is a public health issue, affecting health and wellbeing, opportunity, and quality of life

# WHAT WE DID



1. Key partners were brought together to co-develop a systems map (i.e., visual diagram) representing a shared vision of the underlying factors that could contribute to preventing VAWG in outdoor public spaces in Belfast<sup>3</sup>



2. Public deliberation
workshops with 45
members of the public
to build on action points from
stakeholders and produce a set of
recommendations for preventing
VAWG in outdoor public spaces<sup>4</sup>

#### Workshops included:

- teenagers
   (16 19 yrs)
- adults (19+ years)
- different genders (female, male, trans, non-binary)
- ethnic minorities
- LGBTQIA+ community
- individuals living with a disability
- people with different socioeconomic status

\*these statistics refer to women and girls surveyed in Northern Ireland









# **RECOMMENDATIONS**

Focus on VAWG prevention solutions that are multilayered and crosssector



Encourage transparent, inclusive, and accountable management and stewardship of outdoor public spaces and public transport



Design visible and practical changes that make outdoor public spaces and transport feel safer during the day and night



Educate about VAWG and acknowledge the full spectrum of violence that often goes unreported



Involve people from diverse cultural, social, and identity groups directly in prevention efforts



Enhance sustainable funding dedicated to preventing VAWG in outdoor public spaces and on transport



Strengthen trust in public institutions to act and deliver meaningful change



# THESE FINDINGS...

- Centre the views of individuals from a diverse range of backgrounds
- Highlight the urgency of the issue for policymakers
- Provide evidence for those in community voluntary/third sector
- Support practitioners in design and regeneration of outdoor public spaces
- Provide practical, community-informed solutions for transport providers to improve public transport environments for women and girls
